Why ORCID?


- **Adopt an industry standard** - ORCID is an independent, not-for-profit organization designed to benefit all stakeholders across research sectors and disciplines
- **Drive scientific discovery** - ORCID's ability to connect research and researchers enhances scientific discovery and improves efficiency in research collaboration
- **Increase recognition** - ORCID helps authors differentiate themselves from every other researcher, gaining discoverability, credit and recognition for all contributions
- **Save time** - ORCID reduces energy spent disambiguating authors and reviewers
- **Encourage transparency** - ORCID provides an automatic linkage among professional activities, research grants, and affiliations, allowing researchers to maintain and control their information in one, secure place
- **Improve the publishing experience** - Authors can elect to have their ORCID record updated each time they publish an article
